Molly Reeves Demo Review

Molly Reeves had access to good art equipment from an early age with one parent an artist and the other a photographer! A great environment to nourish a creative soul. Her heart settled on painting in oils.

At the March meeting Molly shared tips for painting birds on boards. The boards are covered with 3 layers of Gesso to decrease their absorbency. Each board has a bright undercoating



of color which she lets peek out in spots throughout the finished painting like sparks of color. Her bird painting collection is unified with the addition of roughly shaped white balls in the distance and the use of a limited palette to bring harmony to the series.

Although she admits to painting on a schedule, just watching her paint was a lesson in freedom. Of note, she kept her

paintbrush in one hand and reloaded it from a palette knife loaded with color in the other. "It keeps my paint handy", she said. She had a lightly drawn picture to build on, but was willing to take

risks on how to accomplish her goals. She would use brushes, her hands, a palette knife or other object if it would make the paint move how she wanted. Much of the detail work (which she starts with when doing birds) was done making dots that she could choose to connect later if needed. If it doesn't work it's OK, it can be painted over until she is happy with the end result.

Molly recommends setting the mood and atmosphere to paint. In Summer she likes to paint outdoors and moves indoors to the studio in Winter. Even the music she listens to while painting adapts to her process. When starting a painting she uses quiet meditative music but by paintings end it is raucous and she is dancing while she paints. She truly exemplified the joy that making art brings to our hearts.



When oil painting she paints dark to light, the opposite of watercolorists. Landscapes require details be painted last but with painting birds they come first leaving the surrounding canvas space available to steady her hand. Pretty smart plan.

Advice: Don't let yourself get inhibited. Give yourself permission to try things! It's fun to play with light, shadows and shapes.

Molly participates in 15 Art Shows and Galleries each year.
