If you don't know what

pastel painting is, Pastel



is an art medium in the form of a stick consisting of pure powdered pigment and a binder. The pigments used in pastels are the same as those used to produce all colored art media. They are sold in two forms, oil pastels and soft pastels (Gary prefers the soft pastels).

As a bonus, Gary says pastel sticks can be transported on airplanes, unlike liquid paints, and he takes them on vacations to enable painting what he sees. Pastels are framed under glass with a matt or spacer to protect the painted surface. No drying time needed. Lots of benefits to this art medium.

## October Workshop Results were viewed

Students brought in their larger paintings done in Shirlee Lind's NCAG October Workshop .

It was fun to see all the different takes on a Venice scene. Very colorful results!

These were Acrylic Collages with

Texture and included using oatmeal for the foliage, foam board for adding layers to the





buildings, 3-D Stucco effects on the walls, etc. Isn't Art Fun!!!



## January's Demo was very colorful!

Our thanks go out to **NCAG Member John Halvorsen** for the demo he presented at the January meeting. John shared a variety of his paintings which showed he has a wide range of interest and some serious talent. He usually works in one of three realms, realism, atmosphere with mist and fog, or the use of bright colors. The beach scenes were nearly photorealistic, yet



the landscapes he shared for the demo used a riot of bright and very unconventional colors – the colors

might be used abstractly (red roads, blue trees, etc.) but the paintings themselves are not abstracts. If the color was removed and you looked at his art in black and white it would still be very recognizable. The color added a lot of fun and excitement for the viewer.

John's process: He said he lightly draws his composition on canvas and makes any adjustments required, using angles to create added interest, before painting the first layer of acrylic paint onto the shapes



. Most of his painting ideas come from his head.

Several of his examples were rolling hills of vineyards, each successive field a different color than the adjacent ones. He admits he likes to put a lot of colors in his paintings and before he is finished he will probably change the color and paint over each section at least three times. Complementary colors are in the back of his mind as he chooses which colors to add for highlights or to place adjacent to each other. Since color is a personal choice he feels you should use the colors you like. By using fast drying acrylics, it is easy to paint over an unwanted color until he is satisfied.

John used the Triangle rule to help trick the viewers eye

and keep them traveling around the painting by placing a color at all three points of a triangle, much as we have been taught to do with items like rocks for composition. Using a script brush, he outlines the



various colors which emphasized them even more. Dried paintings are covered with a finish spray by Winsor Newton. These colorful paintings attract buyers at shows he has been in and they sell well.



Hint: Always make sure your acrylic paint brush is damp before you start painting to help the paint move!

Hint: Drill a hole in the intersection of a T-square and attach a wing nut in the hole. Now the T-square can be angled to make a line more consistent when painting toward a vanishing point (esp useful with architecture).

Hint: Make your own frames economically with narrow

strips of wood available at Home Depot. Use two layers of thin wood strips. Attach with brad nails into the sides of your canvas. No mitered edges are needed, just straight cuts. The second layer can be added on top of

the first and covers the raw edge of the first layer. It produced a floating frame effect! Corners on the outer layer can be filled with wood filler and sanded down & painted. Even large paintings can be framed this way for less than \$20.



#### Have you heard of the Torrit Grey Competition?

Gamblin's Oil Paint Company, located in Portland, recycles pigments they recover from their Torit air filtration system each year. These combined pigments produce a grey paint which they then make into 37ml paint tubes that are given away with purchase of Gamblin materials through local fine art material retailers while supplies last. This store promotion runs each year through the end of April in celebration of Earth Day, it not only recycles pigment dust into paint but focuses artists on the importance of recycling, studio and environmental safety. After receiving the free paint, you can paint a picture with a palette limited to white, black and Torrit Grey and enter their online competition in the Fall.
