

Public Relations Committee Forming



The Art of Critiquing the Art

Our critiques are the highlight of every meeting in member satisfaction. Please bring a painting or two to the next meeting (day or evening) and let us all see what you have been up to with your art.

Our evening Critique Master **Wendy DeHart** (also our new treasurer) shared the aspects she considers when critiquing an art piece. Bringing a painting in for the Critique session is a learning opportunity for the entire group. Artists are usually their own worst critic, so we can look for the good parts and draw attention to them



and explain why they worked. The purpose of a Critique is to help the artist communicate what they want to convey, not impose our idea of what we think their painting should be. Initially Wendy or Gary Michael (our day Critique Master) ask questions to clarify the artists' intent

or purpose in painting the subject. Wendy then shared the **key points** she uses to evaluate a painting. Things we should be keeping in the back of our head whenever we paint for a more successful outcome....

Consider the **composition**, is it pleasing and does it hold the viewers interest? Are **values** used well throughout the piece? Is your eye led through the painting to a **focal point** yet allowed some **resting spots**? **Is color used effectively**...in either a complimentary, analogous, monochromatic, high key or low key way? Is the **perspective showing correct proportions** in all work from still life to landscapes? Do the **masses vary in size** and are the **shapes well designed**? Is there **gesture and movement**? Are the **edges hard and soft** in the right places? Are **reflective surfaces evident** on the forms? Is the light source evident from correct areas showing **high light and shade? How skillfully was this all achieved**? A Critic has a lot to consider!.

Critique Courtesy -

Pagers and phones should be turned off before the critique begins. Please raise your hand to speak so only one person has the floor at a time and can talk without interruptions, this will allow everyone to hear the conversation and enjoy this learning process fully.

NCAG Meetings are held at the Oak Grove Water District offices: 14496 SE River Road, Milwaukie, Or . From 99E (McLoughlin Blvd) turn west (toward the river) on Oak Grove Blvd., turn right on Rupert Dr. for a block and then left back onto Oak Grove Blvd., at stop sign turn right onto River Rd., go 1 block and turn right onto Maple St. The building is on the corner of River Rd and Maple St. and has a green roof. Please use outside entry door on the left-see arrow below.



We try to avoid the main office door as it rings a bell when door is opened and distracts workers inside.
