January Demonstrations

January's demo's were a preview of our next two workshops. John Halverson will show us how to create dramatic skies on January 26. We already learned two-thirds of the painting should be sky and one-third land or water. John prefers we bring 5 to 6 smaller sized canvas, paper or other support to paint on. His emphasis is on how to create different dramatic skies to use as reference rather than focusing on completing one painting, finishing with five or six examples of dramatic skies.

Next, **Shirlee Lind** showed us the project for her 3-dimensional collage painting and talked about how she'll show us how to built up your painting with foam and poster board to create dimension, adding clay to sculpture some areas while using various other things you have at home (fruit web bags for windows, beans for cobblestones, oatmeal and plastic foliage, etc.) and a whole lot of Gesso to glue it together, to create a breathtaking painting. Her class will be three consecutive Saturdays in February. There is still room for a few more artists.
