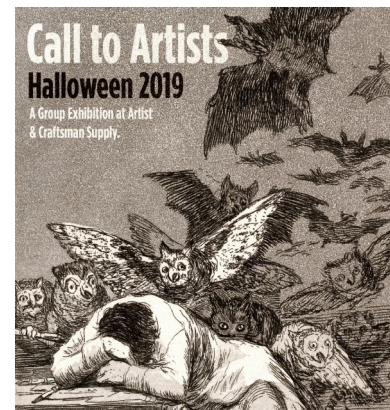


Artist and Craftsman Supply

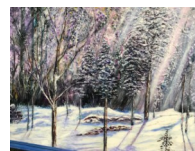

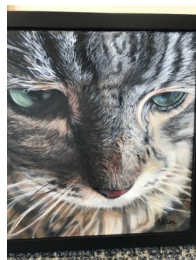

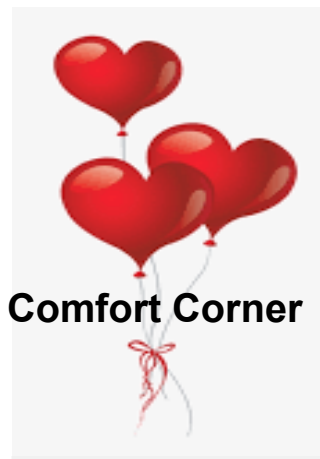
