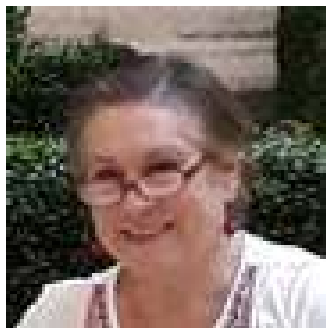

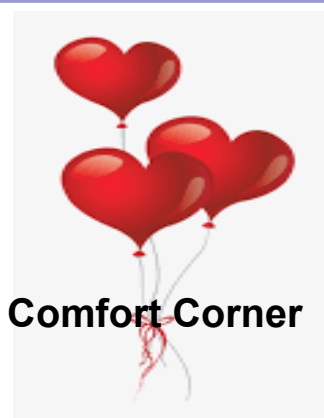

Send us your completed documents and your images in jpeg format and we will set up your gallery and page. If you would like assistance in creating your documents and assembling your photos contact webmaster@ncartsguild.com or ask one of the board members. Hover on the 'member gallery' tab on the website to see existing member galleries for inspiration.

The Artist's Biography serves to provide the reader with a story about you as an artist and learn about your career credentials. A biography is not the same as a résumé. It contains much of the same information as a résumé, however, where a résumé or CV (curriculum vitae) is written in a listing format, a biography is written in an editorial style. It is also not the same as an Artist's Statement, which is more about your creative inspiration, materials, style, and artistic vision.

The Artist Statement Here are some tips and ideas for all artists to think about when composing a new statement or revising their current artist statement.

1. **Keep the Statement Simple** Basically, an artist statement is an introduction to the art, without the artist being there.
2. **The Statement Should Tell Why:** The artist is telling the reader the personal reasons why they create their art.
3. **The Statement Should Tell How** For example a short sentence or two about the artistic process or describing if there are any special techniques that were used in producing this art
4. **What it Means to the Artist** Overall, this is a personal statement of the meaning of the art for the artist
5. **Keep it Short** Attention spans are short and your statement won't be read if it's too long.
