



# **Elections on horizon**

This is the time of year for everyone to think about how you can best serve the guild in the coming year. February is the month we nominate new officers. We vote in March and install officers in April. Below are listed the duties of each officer.

**PRESIDENT:** To plan and preside at Board, regular monthly meeting of the membership and Annual Meetings. To appoint Chairpersons of Committees; to appoint members of each Committee in consultation with that Chairperson; to disband Committees; all actions subject to Board approval. Is authorized signer of checks in the absence of the Treasurer. Sees that Officers have what is needed to perform their duties. Is ex-officio member of all Committees. Is responsible for keeping the membership currently informed on the affairs of the NCAG.

VICE-PRESIDENT: Presides at all meetings in the absence of the President. Represents the President when so needed.

**SECRETARY:** Shall take minutes of the Board, monthly, and Annual Meetings. Reads and replies to all business correspondence and maintains document files.

**TREASURER:** Receives all dues, donations, fees, etc.; which shall be deposited in a financial institution approved by the Board. Disburses funds as appropriate. Maintains records of all financial transactions required by the organization and the State and Federal governments. Is primary signer of checks for the organization. Submits appropriate reports to the State and Federal governments as required by law. Presents a current written financial report at each monthly membership meeting. Presents an audited financial report to the membership at the Annual Meeting.

If you are interested in becoming an officer or committee leader, please talk to current Board members or attend a Board meeting.
