

### President's Message



There have been many changes in the past year to galleries and guilds in Portland and Clackamas County. Paul Clendenin, President of **Portland Fine Arts Guild**, responded to our query, with a quick status report. They are not currently meeting in person, but are able to hold popular day and evening classes using ZOOM. <u>Three Rivers Art Guild</u> is also meeting by ZOOM only, and their **Gallery** is closed due to loss of their traditional venues.

New galleries are opening and their application forms are available online for submission and jurying. Among them are the **Blue Pine Gallery & Gifts -Teaching Center** in Gresham, which is just starting up on November 15. The business is owned by Marcia Morrow, Beth Schilling, and Bonnie Moore.
