President's Message

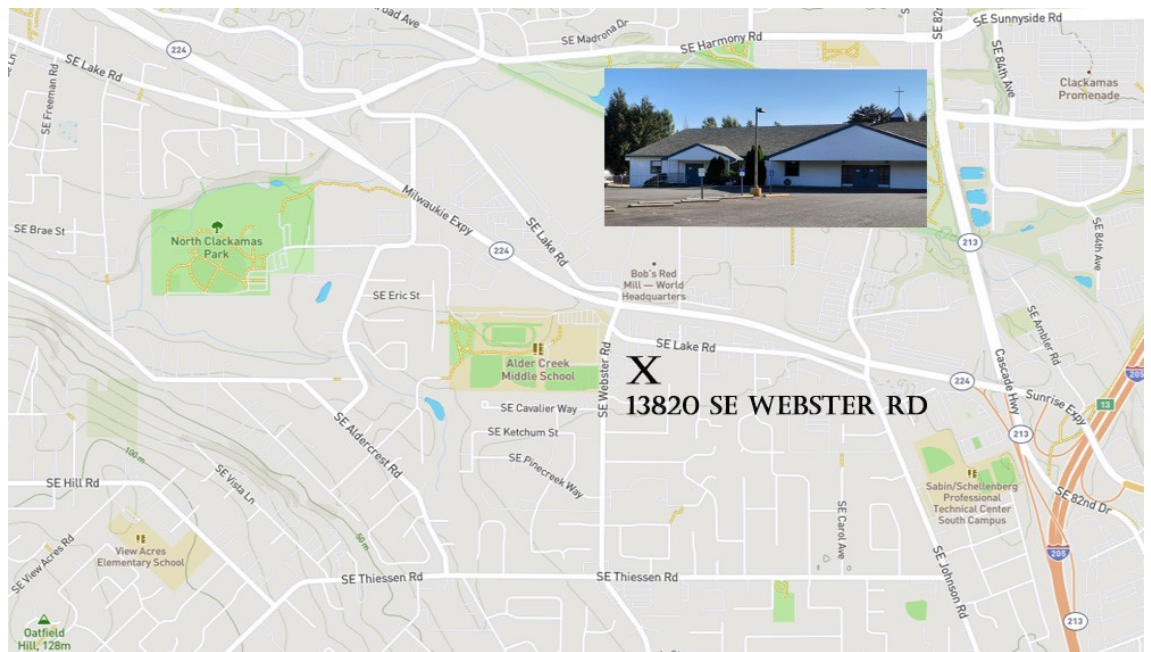

Pam Davis reviewed our work in the outdoor setting at the park. Here she leads a discussion of one of Connie Emmons' paintings.

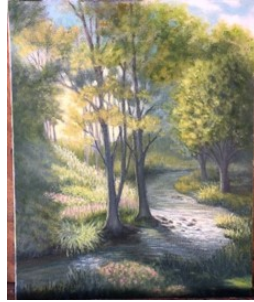

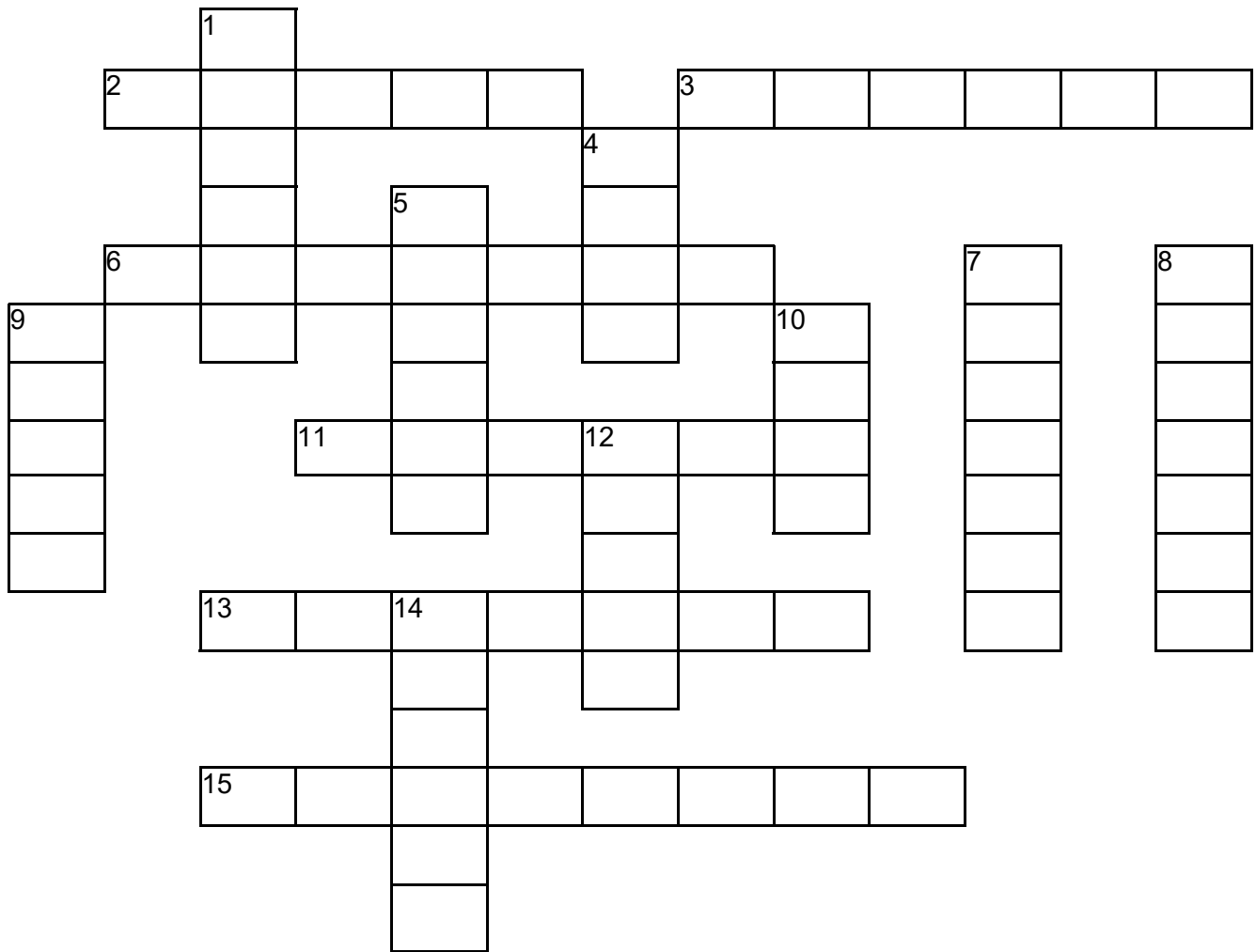


PAINT 4 FUN IS BACK!
