


President's Message

The Guild was started on March 17, 1993, with Norma Schneider as the leader. There were 18 of her friends attending that first meeting, whether they painted or not! By June of 1993 they had 56 members, who became the Charter Members.

In 2010, we started a search for a new meeting place. In April 2011, we celebrated our 18th anniversary and our first meeting at the Oak Lodge Water District office. Since that time, we have been several places and now are meeting at Saving Grace Church.

Sharon Payne joined the Guild in 1997 and is one of the longest-time members with Bea Greening that year. Gene Yates joined in 1998. In 2012 Sharon took on the job as Historian. Since the earlier Historian had passed, and the family threw everything away before the Guild could retrieve it. Norma and Sharon put it together from paper records. Sharon started a scrapbook for the Guild as a donation since we didn't have one before. The scrapbook will also be at the meeting for your review and enjoyment. Sharon's full history document will be posted to the website.

New galleries are opening and their application forms are available online for submission and jurying. Among them are the Blue Pine Gallery & Gifts -Teaching Center in Gresham, which is just starting up on November 15. The business is owned by Marcia Morrow, Beth Schilling, and Bonnie Moore.
