Kathy showed us her work on slates, used indoor and out, free standing or displayed on easels. Shirlee has painted on rounded and irregular "river rocks" which can be used in decor or garden art. They

described their processes and special treatments they have discovered in their experience. This may be an upcoming workshop!
