

#### June Demo—Using Texture in Painting



Our June meeting was carried away by the demo by Pamela Smithsted on using textures for painting in acrylics. The use of various painting media created relief textures, and then the addition of paints added dimension to her realistic landscapes. One notable painting showed the use of fabric to show the drapes of clothing on a central figure in 3D.

Pamela's work was not confined to the use of traditional surfaces which had advantages we can bring into our own painting. Aluminum sheets, Cradle Board, lightweight Multimedia Art Board are all examples of surfaces used in her work. Acrylic pours were used in parts of her paintings, one example was shown as a way to achieve unique treatments for sky. Products such as Durham Rock Hard Putty, and PVA Glue were used in shaping river rocks, bricks, sand and tree bark. These treatments used in the foreground of her paintings gave great depth.


