


10/17/22 Clackamas County is now at low risk for community spread of COVID-19 according to the <u>CDC.</u> (Ctrl Click)

NON-TOXIC OIL PAINTING, by Sara Star

There are many concerns about the fumes from solvents like turpentine and odorless mineral spirits in oil painting. Many artists avoid oil painting because of the fumes' danger to pets and children and fears about medical damage from long term exposure. Yet there are many options for solvent free oil painting and you may be surprised to learn many great classic painters did not use spirits.

If you use turpentine or odorless mineral spirits, always use them in a well ventilated area with, for example, an open window or fan that moves air flow to and from outside. Air purifying machines are also recommended. Please keep the solvents in sealed containers that you only have open while you are cleaning brushes or doing the thin painting layer.

There are many alternatives now to painting with toxic solvents. You can thin paint with fast drying thin oils like walnut, safflower and blends like Sennelier green4oil and Gamblin solvent free mediums. You can also paint thinly with dry brushing techniques calling for no thinning mediums.

There are lines of artist colors with evaporating surfactant additives that allow the oil paints to mix and be soluble initially with water until they have dried. Some water soluble oil brands include Grumbacher Max, Holbein Duo, Cobra, Windsor Newton Artisan, Lukas Berlin and many more. Many traditional artists are suspicious of water soluble oils; however, the technology used comes from car manufacturing and so these colors have been thoroughly road tested! I have pictures I painted with Artisan colors 20 years ago that have held up with no issues.

When it comes to cleaning your brushes, it is easy to avoid solvents like turpentine and odorless mineral spirits by using cheap cooking oils like safflower oil to get the majority of pigments out and then washing your brushes with soap and water, Murphy's oil soap is very popular for brush cleaning, but my preference is Dr. Bronner's or regular old Dawn for cutting the oil. Rinse, squeeze out excess water and then lay your brushes flat to dry.
