

GRANT OPPORTUNITY

We have an opportunity to apply for a Project Grant from Clackamas County Cultural Coalition for the year **2023**. The Deadline is in mid-October, and we have a volunteer to try writing up the grant. It has been suggested that our project should be related to "Increasing Membership", and one manner of doing that is to hold a Show and Sale (c'mon kids!). With the money from a grant, we can rent a decent venue for 3 days, and provide a judge, and appropriate publicity. Since 2018, we have held 2 such events, and I'm told these were only shadows of what we were able to show in the past.

Another method of increasing membership is to reach out for new instructors from outside the Guild to provide demos and workshops, publicizing them to members and attracting others. The opportunity to show and sell our work is a big draw to new members! The Grant funds could be used to pay the fees asked by prominent artists to come to us.

We have many new things going on, with the website upgrades, and Facebook page re-fresh. We have less than a month to prepare the grant application right now, and the appointment of a Show Coordinator(s) is essential for the Plan A Please volunteer. Most members would be willing to help, so it isn't as solo as it may sound. Please contact me, Betty Kellogg, or Barbara Seliner, and NCAG can do this. Thank you. All suggestions are welcome.
